4th October 1946 to 24th November 1948 Leonard was Attendant to Captain Muldowney.

25th November 1948 to the 11th March 1949 he was at Sheerness Camp.

30th June 1949 to 22nd June 1950 he was at RM Rifle Range, Sheerness.

Leonard was awarded the 39/45 Star, Atlantic Star, Africa Star, War Medal and the France & Germany Clasp.

Leonard married Lily on the 16th April 1949

After Service:

Leonard and Lily moved to 2 St. Mary's Cottages in 1950 and was employed as Pig Man and General Farm Labourer at Water Farm, Elham. It was Leonard who planted the row of poplar trees which follow the route of the Nailbourne.

Family Story: Whilst at St. Mary's Cottages the family increased, and they eventually moved to Water Farm.
